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

The northernmost point of Greenland, Cape Morris Jesup, is only 740 km from then North Pole. The southernmost point is Cape Farewell, which lies at about the same latitude as Oslo in Norway



### Fishing and Hunting

Fishing is the lifeline of Greenland and the primary industry of the country. Greenland has the legislative competence for the fisheries sector. The fisheries for prawns and Greenland halibut are regulated by quota and license regulations decided by the Cabinet. Decisions are based on biological advice to ensure a sustainable use of the natural resources.





### Political Parties in Greenland

### **Sorlaat Partiiat (Roots)**

Greenlands youngest party, formed in 2008 and not in parliament, this party stands for social liberalism with the government out of the local and national businesses. Democracy, financial independence and integrity are corner stones in this party.

#### Siumut (Forward)

The biggest party in Greenlandic politics, founded as early in 1977 this party stands for social democratic affairs and equality amongst the people. Loyal to the Danish Crown and Government this party still stands for independence and self-governance in Greenland.

#### **Inuit Ataqatigiit** (Unified Inuit)

This leftwing oriented party was found in November 1976 with demands of independence and recognition as one people. Il-loyal to the Danish Crown and Government the party is somewhat a socialistic party.

### Kattussegatigiit Partiiat (Alliance of Candidates)

Formerly represented by individual candidates a formal party was born in October 2005. This party is mostly represented in the northern part of Greenland with a strong Mayor in Ilulissat.

### **Demokraatit** (Democrats)

Found as early at the end of 2002, this party is social liberal, right in the middle of the two political wings in Greenland.

### Atassut (Unity)

This party was founded at the end of the 1970'ies, being loyal to the Danish Crown and Government this party is of a green liberal mentality and stand for unity within the Royal Danish Realm.

POLITICAL PARTIES IN GREENLAND 35

Siumut have since the introduction of the Greenland Home Rule in 1979 been in government, in coalition with Inuit Ataqatigiit and Atassut at different times. The younger parties, Kattusseqatigiit Partiiat, Demokraatit and Sorlaat Partiiat have only been in opposition concerning national politics but form a opposition to those in power at all times.

### The world's largest island

Geographical Greenland is part of the North American continent, geopolitical a part of Europe. Greenland is a mountainous country and the world's largest island with a total area of 2,415,100 sq. km. Of this 85 percent is covered with ice, while the rest is free of ice. The temperature of the warmest month does not exceed 10 degrees celcius. Generally speaking, the further north, the colder, drier and less windy is becomes. July is the warmest month, while February and March are the coldest.
